
Rose Parr—Healthy Quilting (www.healthyquilting.com)

"Sew Smart - The Ergonomics of Healthy Quilting" is a live Power-Point presentation that applies ergonomic theory to your crafting life. From cutting and sewing posture to stretches designed to be done at your sewing table. Strategies and tips are designed to "use what you

have" to stay pain-free. Rose recommends viewing the program from your sewing space so that you can immediately relate to your own situation. She will answer questions about ergonomics and studio design at the end of her talk, and we can email her questions about personal modifications to stretches for up to 30 days after her talk.

Rose holds professional certifications in Holistic Nutrition, Ergonomics, Personal Training, Home Economics, Reiki, and more. She says, "My ergonomic improvements / strategies are based on documented research. The health and wellness information I present is selected specifically for the chronic conditions and common problem areas that makers encounter; it is based on health industry standards of practice and not on 'what worked for me.'"


#### RETREAT!!!

## Maye River Quilters Guild

March 6, 2021, Guild Meeting via ZOOM

President **Linda Forry** opened the meeting at 10:00 am. She introduced two new members, Teri Levin and Kelly Coombs. We had 47 members present.

The minutes from the February guild meeting were approved as published in the March newsletter. The treasurer's report was accepted as published, and will be filed for audit.

**Linda Forry** reminded the membership of the drive-through drop-off event on March 6 from 1-2 pm at the Church of the Palms at 1425 Okatie Highway. Members can return raffle ticket stubs and money. Membership chair **Sandra Walsh** will distribute MRQ membership cards. Charity quilts can be dropped off, Birthday Bundles or donations for future Birthday Bundles can also be delivered. **Linda Forry** will have the acrylic 5 x 7 holders for the quilt tool caddy for those who ordered one earlier.

The guild meeting next month will be April 10th, so as not to conflict with Easter. At that meeting members are encouraged to submit ideas for our charitable interest project for next year. We will be voting to choose our next charity at the May meeting.

Eileen Keohane spoke about the upcoming guild elections for board members. She began by reminding the members of the duties assigned to the various offices, then introduced the slate of officers the board is presenting. They are Fran Oblander-President, Gaye Paquet-Vice President, Julie Hiscox-Secretary, Jean LeBlanc-Treasurer, and Lill Helming-Member at Large. Each candidate was asked to briefly address the membership and say something about how long they have been a member of the guild, and perhaps any previous jobs they may have held within MRQ so people can see who they are. Linda Forry called for nominations from the floor, and there were none. Linda spoke about our election process to be held in April. Due to the ongoing pandemic, we will be voting online within the regulations for emergency voting. This requires 80% participation from the members to comply with SC law for emergency voting.

**Debi Bacon** gave us an update on guild quilt retreats. She has spoken with Epworth in St. Simons, GA. They have confirmed that they are closed to outside users through at least July 31, as they have a private contract to house workers. We currently have a reservation with them for October 8-10, 2021, and the guild has previously given them an \$800 deposit. We could possibly change this date, and perhaps increase the length of the retreat by a day as this is over Columbus Day Weekend. We will need a minimum of 10 people to attend. **Debi** will survey the membership on interest in this retreat, and if we go forward with an October retreat, signups will begin in August. The deposit is not refundable so we must plan a retreat in order to use our deposit.

Nancy Vandenburg informed us that of the 2000 raffle tickets printed, she currently has 240 tickets left to distribute. Money and ticket stubs are due back to her by April 1, and the raffle will occur on May 1. The publicity committee had a picture of our beautiful quilt included in a story in the Bluffton Sun, which was successful and produced an increase in ticket sales. Our thanks to Pat Cohen and June Jones for their work on publicity.

**Eileen Keohane** gave a report on our charitable interest project for this year. She distributed 8 quilts to the Bluffton Police Department; they will carry these in their patrol cars for use as needed. The Pregnancy Center of the Lowcountry received 12 more quilts for distribution to their clients. We have distributed 36 quilts since the fall, and hope to continue these donations.

Fran Oblander reviewed the remaining programs for the spring. Linda Forry will present her program today on making a quilt tool caddy using an acrylic photo stand. Members who attend this meeting on Zoom will receive a free pattern for this. April's meeting will be a program by Rose Parr on setting up our sewing space in an ergonomically proper way. She recommends that we be in our sewing area for this talk, so that we can assess our needs.

May's program will be the induction of new officers, and we will also have a presentation of awards and a reflection on the past year. There will be a breakout into small groups included.

June will be our annual round-robin demo day, to be held on Zoom. Currently the demos include paper-piecing, half-square triangles, sewing curves, log cabins, and making Dresden plate blocks. **Fran** is in need of volunteers to demonstrate at the June 5 meeting.

In order to increase donations to the Birthday Bundles fundraiser, **Sharon Savasta-no** and **Karla Ward** have reached out to the whole guild to donate any items they may not be using, and they will make up or add to existing Birthday Bundles for bidding on our website. As this is a major fundraiser for our guild, members are asked to make up a Birthday Bundle during the month of their birthday, send a photo to the ladies who will arrange to have the bundle posted for aution. March 22 is the cut-off date for Bundles to appear before the April meeting.

We've received information of a new quilt show this spring, in Landrum, SC. That is about a four hour drive from here, and it is scheduled for May 1, 2021 which conflicts with our May meeting. For those interested in attending, the information indicates that this is the first annual "Quilters Rock" Landrum City Wide Quilt Show, and quilts will be displayed in local businesses or in the open air market area. Contact elainesattic@yahoo.com with any questions.

The members were broken out into breakout rooms of about 6, where we could introduce ourselves to others, and discuss ideas for programs and workshops for next year. The breakout rooms are popular with the membership, as we have been unable to socialize for a year and many of us don't know the newer members. Hopefully we will be able to meet in person soon, but Palmetto Electric controls the timeline for this to happen.

**Linda Forry** did a wonderful demonstration of how to make a quilt tool caddy from a  $5 \times 7$  acrylic photo stand and fabric. Members in attendance will receive a free pattern with directions for this great project. **Linda** adjourned the meeting at 11:25 am.


