





MRQ 2023 BLOCK CHALLENGE



QUILT CHALLENGE GUIDELINES:

- Present a finished quilt (quilted and bound) at the May meeting
- Quilt may include one or more of the 11 blocks demonstrated, you can choose the traditional, wonky/modern or both.
- You may include all three challenges in your creation.
 - ♦ Traditional or Wonky block—you may use any or all of the 10 blocks presented.
 - Border Mania—you may use any of the fancy border ideas presented in September or create a fancy border of your own.
 - Ugly Fat Quarter—you may use the ugly fat quarter given out by Diane Kretkowski.
- Minimum quilt size is 24" x 36", but may be as large as you wish.
- You may embellish or not, your choice.
- Quilt must be completed and bound for submission in May.
- Labels must be on the back of the quilted items to be judged in May. The label should include your name and the name of the challenge(s) you wish to be judged on. Label can be paper and pinned on. Please write clearly.
- Use your imagination!
- Challenge your creativity!
- Prizes will be awarded for:
 - ◊ Best use of Ugly Fat Quarter
 - Best use of Monthly Featured Blocks
 - ♦ Best use of a Fancy Border
 - ♦ Most Creative Border
 - Triple Challenge Award Best use of FQ, Monthly featured blocks, and border in same quilt
 - Other Awards as determined by Program and Workshop chairs

AMISH QUILTS

Our most recent fabric donation included some fabric that had the original store wrap on it and someone had written "Amish" on it. I'm not sure why it was written there as I don't see any information on the store website indicating it is an Amish business but there is a pattern on the site called "Amish Bars". More about that later.

In the 1870s, the Amish eschewed quilting as being 'elaborate, luxurious and worldly' and therefore not appropriate for their traditional way of life. When they first started quilting, their quilts were one solid color, usually brown, blue, rust or black, but the hand quilting done was very intricate and decorative, often including swirling feathers, curves and grids. Note that the Amish would often use a treadle machine for the piecing but the quilting is always done by hand.

Over time, basic piecing and more colors were added. One of the most basic patterns was a series of stripes or bars with one or two borders around them. The large stripes and borders left spaces for the Amish quilters to do their beautiful hand quilting. Below are two variations of Amish bar quilts: the first is a traditional version and the second is the pattern sold by the fabric store. The more 'modern' version is similar to the traditional but adds a second border around the bars.




Amish traditions of economy are displayed in their quilts. The scrap quilts they made were pieced from fabrics collected from people in the Amish community. It was said that if a young woman collected 999 scraps from the community and collected the 1,000th scrap from her true love, their marriage would flourish. A common pattern, the Postage Stamp Quilt, can have over 7,000 squares. Another favorite pattern was the star pattern, also pieced from collected fabrics. JULIE'S JOTTINGS Julie Hiscox
