Some of you may not be aware that two of our Charter Members lost their spouses this past year and both of these ladies will be moving away very shortly. I have chosen to spotlight both of these sweet, sweet ladies this month,

JANET SWAN'S QUILT JOURNEY

In 1983, we moved for the fifth time to Fayetteville, NC. We were empty nesters for the first time and I was not working. I saw an ad in the paper for a lap quilting class and it was only \$5 for eight weeks. Who could pass that up? I did not know what lap quilting was but I would find out.



We started on a sampler quilt with 12-inch blocks. We learned to draft, cut out pieces using cereal boxes for template material and then cutting them out with scissors. We had the first three done and the teacher showed us how to hand quilt (everything was hand quilted in those days). She wanted them done by the next class as we only had two weeks left. Everyone was complaining but I could not see what the big problem was.

Some of the blocks were really funny as about half had pulled them too tight and they looked like B cups. She went to each one and told them the problem and how to fix it. The teacher got to me and smoothed her hand over my flat block. I was so proud. She said my stitches were even and not pulled too tight. Now if I could get them a little smaller, I would have it made. I did not know how to count the stitches so I asked how small do I have to make them? She said "we strive for 12 inches per inch" but she did not expect me to do that at first as it took a lot of practice. I asked her how many I had per inch. She said about 1 ½. I had just basted the blocks. I was so embarrassed but I learned my lesson.

My mother said she had some of my grandmother's quilting in a box for 25 years and I might like them.

One was a top and over the next year I quilted the top just in time for the quilt show the guild I had joined was having. My grandmother and I won a blue ribbon. That was all it took; I have been quilting for 41 years.

The best thing as we moved nine more times, I knew I could find friends at a quilt meeting in each town. None have been as friendly and helpful and nice as the friends I have made at MRQ. I will treasure these friendships as I move, probably for the last time.

If you don't have that information by the April meeting no worries we can adjust at the May meeting when you turn in your quilt.
