





Thank you to everyone for your positive support for our Charitable Interest projects. The Pines of Bluffton, the Vineyard and the Caris Hospice are excited to be receiving the fruits of our labors.

We are planning 2 "Sit & Sew" dates....September 11 and November 6 following our regular meetings. Please plan on joining us to work on our projects. September 11, we will be working on bibs and pillowcases. November 6, we will be working on fidget quilts. Linda Forry is coordinating the November Sit & Sew. Sign-up sheets will be at the August meeting.

Brandy at Blue Heron Stitchery has graciously offered sewing space on Thursday for those members wanting to work with other sewists. Kits have been dropped off at the Blue Heron Stitchery for members to stop and pick up 1 or 2, sew the kit and either return to the shop or bring to a scheduled meeting and drop it off. Please sign the sheet indicating that you took a kit.

Pat Cohen has graciously offered to be a drop off spot for completed items from members living in Sun City. Thank you Pat and Brandy.

Ann Piercy and a visiting friend assisted me in assembling kits from our donated fabrics. Completing all of the kits will meet our general goal for items, but not fully meet the needs of the charitable groups. I encourage everyone to dive into your stash and look for fabrics that can be used. One yard of fabric will make 1 pillow case or 1 bib. A small amount with great impact. I am more than willing to cut more kits, however, I will need the fabric to do that. For pillowcases, I am also willing to serge the seams and my serger is set up and ready to go.

At the suggestion at the July Zoom meeting, I am looking at ordering labels for us to sew into the articles so recipients know who provided the articles for them. I think this is a grand idea. And also thank those that have helped me work on this aspect, especially Brandy Yingling and Linda Forry.

I was also asked to check with the Pines on how many veterans they have living in their facility and whether we can use Red, White and Blue to honor these residents. I was able to reach the Activities Director and she gave a thumbs up....but asked that the red fabric be pre-washed. 10 veterans currently reside at the Pines.

The directions for the Burrito pillowcase and the bib is attached to this newsletter. I will have patterns at the August meeting for those who would like them.

Maye River Quilters Guild Minutes

July 10, 2021, Guild Meeting via ZOOM

President Fran Oblander opened the meeting on Zoom at 10:00 am. There were members present, with no new members or visitors attending.

President Fran Oblander opened the meeting at 10:02 a.m. on ZOOM. There were 41 members present. Fran introduced new member **Suzanne McClure**.

Vice President Gaye Paquet announced that Palmetto Electric is reopening their meeting room for our use. The July meeting will be our last zoom meeting. Future meeting dates at Palmetto Electric will be: August 7, September 11, October 2, November 6 and December 4. First Responders chair **Eileen Keohane**, who is absent to-day, has been notified to have volunteers on hand for our first in person meeting!

The minutes from the June guild meeting were approved as published in the July newsletter. The treasurer's report was accepted as published and will be filed for audit.

Fran noted that we still do not have Chairs for the Raffle Quilt and Publicity committees. Please contact Fran if you are interested in serving in those positions. We have two volunteers for Photographer, and both volunteers will share the duties. We also need committee members for most of the committees. Fran will be contacting members to fill these positions.

Since August will be our first in-person meeting in eighteen months, Fran asked that members limit Show-and-Tell to one or two quilts per person at the August meeting.

Fran anticipates that there will be an update to the meeting format in the near future.

Workshops Chair, **Pat Wys**, has been working very hard on the workshop schedule. **Debi Bacon** will do a workshop on either Rapid-Fire Hunter's Star or A Place to Quilt; choice to be voted on by poll of the membership. **Becky Robinson** will do a workshop and **Diana Mann** will present her workshop virtually. **Diane Knott** is scheduled for November; she has written two books for CNT and has lots of experience. **Joan Darr** is heading up our first Mystery Quilt. **Judy Hertel** is leading an initiative to start small special interest groups, and Judy will present a number of topics to choose from. **Karla Ward** and **Sharon Savastano** are starting up a mentor program. They will be asking members to list skills they would be willing to teach fellow guild members. Two Sit-and-Sews (or Sit 'n' Sew) are planned so far. **Mindy Weaver** will be talking about the first one in September, and **Linda Forry** will be leading one in November.

Joan Darr said the Mystery Quilt will start at the August 7th meeting. The quilt is called "Spot On" and was designed with the Corner Beam ruler. Registrants will receive the Corner Beam ruler with the first clue. The quilt is designed to be two colors – a neutral background and a main color, which can be one constant color or one color family. Participants will get a set of clues each month. Joan suggests labeling each part and each clue every month, as that info will be important when completing the quilt. Joan has made it – it's fun, easy, and turns out beautifully. Quilt will be a generous lap size. Cost is \$25 with the ruler, or \$10 without. Quilt needs five yards of each color of fabric. Pat suggested that we start the mystery quilt in September so Joan can register people at the August meeting. Registration

form will also be included with the next newsletter.

Fran showed two quilts for **Debi Bacon's** Workshop. Members were polled to select one of the designs. 31 of 40 members voted; 58% voted for A Place to Quilt; 42% for Rapid Fire Hunter's Star. Since voting was so close, we might plan to do the Rapid-Fire Hunter's Star in the spring. **Pat Wys** will send the registration form to **Gaye** to be included in the next newsletter.

April Boyd, Programs Chair, said the August program will be the Yard Sale, since we will be back in the building. **Karla and Sharon** will determine the cost for tables. **April** will try to get the scissor sharpening guy there as well. **April** will send an email to members with registration information. October program will be Diana Mann; November program will be Diane Knott; December program will be the Christmas party. April plans to have food, maybe Christmas baskets and maybe a small gift exchange. Gift exchange will not be mandatory; bring one – get one. **Fran** suggested that the registration form for the Yard Sale be bundled with the form for **Debi Ba-con's** workshop, and the form for the Mystery Quilt, all in one email from **Gaye** to the membership.

Sharon Savastano, Fundraising Co-chair, said thank you for July bundles. Members can bring bundles to the August meeting since we will be back in person.

Mindy Weaver, Charitable Interest Chair, said the Pines of Bluffton is excited we voted to make adult bibs and pillowcases for them. Linda Forry talked to the Vineyard about doing fidget quilts for them. **Fran** talked to a hospice facility that is also interested in fidget quilts. Anne Pearcy and Mindy put together 20 bib and 40 pillowcase kits with fabrics donated by Pat Wys, and Brandy Yingling from Blue Heron. **Mindy** will bring kits to the August meeting and will leave some kits at Blue Heron for pickup. Linda Robinson sent a pattern to Mindy that didn't have buttons or pieces that could be picked off, and for this reason this is the pattern that will be used. The Pines wants the bibs as simple as possible. Mindy has planned a Sit-and-Sew (or Sit 'n' Sew) on September 11th to make Bibs and Pillowcases. Linda Forry is doing a Sit-and-Sew (or Sit 'n' Sew) on November 6th to make fidget quilts. Members can sign up at the August meeting for each Sit-and-Sew (or Sit 'n' Sew) session. Mindy will check with Camille at the Pines to find out whether members can use prewashed red fabric for the bibs. **Pat Cohen** asked if we could put a little label on our donation items. **Mindy** will look for labels that we could get to put on the items with the MRQG name. Someone suggested a stamped label; **Pat** has about 100 sheets of printable label paper if someone wants to do that. Committee will consider options and decide how to proceed.

Linda Robinson, Hospitality Chair, will be out of town until July 30th , but will schedule a timely meeting to organize for the August Guild meeting.

Fran said we have 14 members signed up for retreat, including one person looking for a roommate. There are six spaces still available. Fill out the registration form and send it in with 50% of cost. Balance will be due September 1.

A breakout session for member interaction was held for ten minutes, then the group returned to the general meeting.

Our program was a tour of six members' sewing rooms. **Karla Ward, Jean LeBlanc, **Sharon Savastano, Connie Davidson, Cynthia Cassidy and Pat Wys** gave us a wonderful look at how they organize their sewing space and lots of ideas how to improve our own space. Winners of the July Birthday Bundles were: #1 Lill Helming, \$32 #2 Lori Smalarz, \$45 #3 Mindy Weaver, \$30 #4 Cynthia Cassidy, \$20

Members were reminded that Sew Suite Studio's Grand Opening is July 14 – 16.

Fran adjourned the meeting at 11:42 a.m.



Maye River Quilters meet the first Saturday of the month unless otherwise posted at the following location:


Palmetto Electric Co-op 1 Cooperative Way, Hardeeville



This <u>Diagonal Seam Tape</u> is a perfect solution for sewing straight diagonal seams without having to mark any lines! The special washi tape is strong, thin, and removes cleanly after sewing projects. Simply place the tape in front of the feed dogs with the red line in front of the needle as the stitch line. The black lines on either side of the center line represent a perfect 1/4" seam allowance and are a great resource to use when making half square triangles, or learning to keep a perfect 1/4". Each roll is 10 yards so it'll last a long time. Get one for your sewing room and



toss another one in your travel bag for going to quilt retreats. \$7.25/roll
