This workshop is currently full.







FIRST RESPONDERS—(SET UP/TAKE DOWN)



July 9, 2022—Church of the Palms

The meeting was called to order by **President Cynthia Cassidy** at 10:00 at the Church of the Palms.

Cynthia reported the minutes of the last meeting were printed in the newsletter. **Liz Penke** moved to accept as published. **Diane Kretowski** seconded. The motion passed.

Cynthia asked for any questions about the financial statement. There were none. The report will be filed for audit.

Cynthia asked the Guild Friends to introduce the guests in attendance. **Kriss Klotz** introduced Charlotte Netherby, **Linda Farineau** introduced Karen Myers and **Karla Ward** introduced Cathy Dale.

Cynthia stated that **Brenda Lucas** audited the financials from the previous guild year. They are in order and will be sent to the accountant. She thanked **Jean Le-Blanc** for her service last year as Treasurer.

Cynthia asked **Joan Darr**, Membership Chair, to confirm a quorum was present. Joan replied that there were 38 present which is more than a quorum.

Cynthia reminded members that a committee of three were appointed to review the bylaws. They were Chair **Lill Helming, Debi Bacon and Suzanne McClure**. The committee recommended amendments as published in the last two newsletters. **Lill** moved to adopt the bylaw amendments as published. The motion passed.

Lill Helming presented this month's Bear Paw Block in a traditional and modern way. This is block #2 that will be presented as part of this years guild challenge. Details will follow in the upcoming newsletter.

Following the break, Amy Southerland and Connie Zafaris from the Charleston Modern Quilt Guild gave a presentation of what characteristics are used in modern quilts and showed many stunning quilts as examples of the modern elements highlighted in each quilt.

Birthday bundle winners were announced.

Cynthia adjourned the meeting at 11:53.
