Face Masks

As I am getting all this ready for Gaye to send out to you, I wanted to say that right now there are several groups making masks for people and health care workers. My cancer cap group is sewing at home making simple masks out of left-over material from the caps. There is also a group from the Sew What Club at Sun City sewing them too. Perhaps you would like to contribute to this cause as a guild. I have included a link to show you how to sew 2 different kinds. I understand there is not much elastic to be had, but you can sew straps. If any of you would like to sew a couple, please do so and then contact me and I will forward them on to the places that we identify could use them. I have a lady from church checking on this and if the Sun City ladies would let me know where theirs are going, I will pass that info on to the guild. With all the guilts being made right now, there should be LOTS of scraps for these. I know these are not effective like the N95 masks, but they are saying the hospital staff are wearing these over their masks to make them last longer and that some of the hospitals are even sterilizing them and reusing them. If you make some, please place them in a zip lock bag before giving them to me. That way they will not get handled as much and the bag can be wiped down. (You can put more than one in a bag) Maybe this could be a COVID-19 Charitable Interest for the guild.


