

Program

One of our favorite programs will be held again in March. There will be several "stations" set up, each with a demonstrator. Members will learn different techniques or skills. Come to the March meeting to learn more!

Workshop—Part 1

Our own Kristine Richardson will conduct a workshop on making a T-Shirt quilt. In March she will teach her construction technique and show us how to adjust the sizes of the T-Shirts to make the most of the designs. She will allow practice time on scrap material which she will provide. Then participants will be sent home with ideas to design their own layout and choose their size. In the second session in April, each participant will come back with her T-Shirts and other fabrics, and Kristine will assist each person to construct her original layout. Her technique requires a walking foot, but no interfacing is necessary. A materials list will be provided upon registering.



Registration fee will be \$30.00, which will cover both 4 hour sessions. Registration form is on the website.

Workshop will be held after the general meetings on March 7, 2020, and April 4, 2020, both dates from 12:30 - 4:30 pm. Location is at Palmetto Electric.

Participants will have to provide their own lunch and drink.

Maye River Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes January 4, 2020

The meeting was called to order by **President Linda Forry** at 10:00 am.

Jean LeBlanc presented the membership report; we had 80 members in attendance and 5 new members joined at the meeting. We also had 7 additional visitors join us for a total attendance of 92. So far 114 members have renewed their 2020 membership.

The minutes from the December meeting were approved as published. The treasurer's report was accepted as written, and will be filed for audit.

Pat Wys conducted a Block of the Month seminar before the meeting, where she shared tips and techniques to be used while piecing these blocks. The techniques are useful for all our piecing and will improve our skills going forward. The group will have a major Show and Tell of finished quilts at a later date to be determined.

As is true each month, we had a wonderful Show and Tell to inspire us all. As we settle in to the winter season here in the low country, we all have lots of projects in mind to keep us busy. Let's remain productive and enhance our Show and Tell during the coming year.

Elaine Laffey introduced our speaker for today's program. Rita Fishel shared her knowledge on Signal Quilts from the Underground Railroad. Rita has a historical interest in documenting safe houses in southern Ohio during the Civil War, and told us many stories that were shared with her from black descendants of slaves who lived in Ohio or passed through using safe houses. We thank Rita for sharing her stories and her sampler quilt with us. Rita also was here to present a workshop on Sunday called Nova, using the Stripology Squared ruler from Creative Grids. Seventeen members attended the workshop to start the year off learning some new quilting skills.

Sandy Graves from the workshop committee reminded us to sign up for the next upcoming workshop, which will be Sunday, April 5. Gyleen Fitzgerald will be visiting us to teach the pattern "Uptown". More information on future programs and workshops can be found on our website, and all members are encouraged to check our website routinely. We are mayeriverquiltguild.com.

Our Christmas stocking project was a huge success and the program committee is grateful for the participation of so many guild members. Viewers choice awards were awarded for the two favorite stockings. Congratulations to everyone who generously donated and participated.

Elaine Laffey announced that the February meeting will be our 5th anniversary celebration, where we will enjoy 2 or 3 Left-Right-Center games using fat quarters. Members are asked to bring 3 fat quarters per game in order to participate. A new addition to our fun will be a fabric swap. Please bring a one-yard piece of quilt shop quality fabric in a brown paper bag for the swap. Our meeting will also include a pot-luck luncheon. Sign-ups for food occurred at the January meeting. Members are being asked to also bring along a copy of your recipe to the meeting. This will help others with food sensitivities choose their options. If your dish requires serving spoons etc, please bring your own along.

Minutes of January 4, 2020 continued ~

The March meeting will be our annual round-robin demonstration. It's always popular and we all leave with a new technique or skill.

Barb Wanthal updated us on the progress of our charity program providing quilts for foster children. One load of quilts has been delivered, and the pile of finished quilts is growing again. The group is in need of about 20 toiletry bags and 20 canvas tote bags. Kits for the tote bags were available at the meeting and should be returned at the February meeting. The committee would like some larger, twin-sized quilts for the older children who are aging out of foster care. Please keep our charity program in mind this winter as you are sewing. Nan Brown is working to arrange for a speaker to attend an upcoming meeting in order to discuss what our efforts mean to the children in foster care.

Linda Forry shared with us several pictures received from Habitat for Humanity families in the Beaufort area who received quilts from us last year. They now have moved into their new homes and shared their joy with us.

Joan Darr spoke about the Quilters of South Carolina organization which has a spring meeting planned in March in Greenville, SC. Gudrun Erla, who designs rulers for Creative Grids, will be the speaker. More information on the group is available quiltersofsc.org.

Denise Nierstedt and Gaye Paquet are working to recruit members to become officers of our guild for the 2020-2021 year. Anyone with an interest in participating in the planning of our guild's future is encouraged to speak with Denise, Gaye, or any current officer.

Raffle tickets for our wonderful quilt are available at all meetings. Members are strongly encouraged to participate in this effort to raise money for our guild. The quilt will be on display in January at Granny's Quilt Fabric and More in Hardeeville. Ticket proceeds must be turned in at the April meeting and the drawing will occur on May 2. The winner will be announced at our May 9 meeting.

Linda Forry has asked that at the April meeting we submit ideas for our charitable interest for next year. There will be a vote at the May meeting on the proposals so that we can have the new committee begin its work over the summer.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:50 am.

Office	Responsibilities
President	Presides at Board and regular meetings, appoints committee chairs unless elected, serves as <i>ex officio</i> member of all committees (except Nominating), and performs usual duties of the office. May serve as secondary signatory for the checking account.
Vice-President	Performs the duties of the President in absence of the President, assumes presidency if nec- essary, is responsible for meeting site location, set-up and take-down, and performs usual duties of the office. May serve as secondary signatory for the checking account.
Secretary	Keeps minutes of Board and regular meetings, conducts general correspondence, coordi- nates and sends information to Guild members when necessary, and performs usual duties of the office.
Treasurer	Keeps all Guild financial records, makes authorized payments, oversees funds, presents an itemized account of receipts and disbursements at each meeting, files income tax returns, makes books available for audit, and performs usual duties of the office. Is the primary signatory for the checking account.
Member-at-Large	Is a voting member of the Board of Directors, assumes responsibilities as delegated by the President, serves as the Chair of the Nominating committee and is a working member of at least one committee as appointed by the President, identifies, cultivates and recruits future leaders, make recommendations for committee appointments, and may fill other Board va- cancies at the discretion of the Board.


Guest Teacher: Gudrun Erla

Gudrun Erla, the designer and owner of GE Designs is born and raised in Iceland. She started quilting at the age of 23. After owning and running quilt shops in her home country and designing patterns along side it, quilting brought her to Minnesota in 2003. Since then Gudrun has been designing full time, publishing patterns and books from her home office in Chanhassen, MN.

Gudrun loves to take traditional ideas and put a little bit of a modern spin on them. Her "quilt as you go" as well as patterns for precuts have been very popular, with easy to follow instructions and quick assembly and finishing. All her patterns are geared toward today's quilt makers, easy and innovative with a modern touch. She has published patterns and books on strip quilts for years and designed the best selling Stripology rulers with Creative Grids.

Gudrun has written 21 books, along with her self published books, she has written for Martingale, C & T, Kansas City Star and Leisure Arts. Her patterns have been published in all the major magazines such as American Patchwork and Quilting, Quiltmaker, Fons & Porter's Love of Quilting and Quilty. She has taped educational classes with both Craftsy and Craft University.

There will be a Workshop offered on Friday using her patterns, Halladora or Glacial Ice and on Sunday, the Workshop offered will use her patterns, Kira, Lexie, and Nova.




