






Charitable Interest

Each suggestion listed will be described in more detail at the meeting. The guild membership will vote on one focus item from the list as our official charitable interest but we can also support others on the list in different ways.

May 1, 2021, Guild Meeting via ZOOM

President Linda Forry opened the meeting on Zoom at 10:00 am. There were 35 members present, and no visitors. New member **Eileen Reichel** joined us today.

The minutes from the April guild meeting were published in the May guild newsletter, and were accepted as written.

The treasurers' report was accepted as written in the newsletter, and will be filed for audit.

Linda Forry announced the sad news that **Linda Pirtle's** husband Chet passed away last week. Chet Pirtle was also the father of our member **Angela Giarratano**.

Linda announced that the raffle ticket committee has sold all 2000 tickets for our raffle quilt. She wanted to recognize the work of those who made the quilt, with **Judy Cain** piecing, **Joanne Moss** doing the applique, **Lynn O'Neal** longarm quilting, **Cindy Taylor** embroidering the label, and **Lill Helming** completing the binding. The quilt was made from a kit called A Celebration of Stars. The winning ticket was drawn by Bluffton resident Jaiden Overland, who is a paramedic/first responder with the St Helena/Ladys Island Fire Department. The winner was Keith Walker from Saugatuck, MI. Chairing the raffle committee this year was **Nancy Vandenberg**, and she sold the winning ticket to Keith, who is her husband's best friend! As seller of the winning ticket, Nancy was awarded a gift certificate to Island Quilters. She will be delivering the quilt to Michigan soon. **Bobbie Giddings** sold the most tickets, and was awarded a gift certificate to Blue Heron Stitchery for her efforts.

Debi Bacon spoke about our upcoming fall retreat to St Christopher's Conference Center on Seabrook Island, SC. There are already 10 members signed up to go, and the maximum will be 24 due to the room capacity. Members deposit checks for retreat will be deposited by the guild right away, and the balance will be due no later than September 1.

Julie Hiscox announced that **Eileen Keohane** still has some lap quilts to be donated to the Bluffton Police Department, as we complete our charity project for this year.

Fran Oblander discussed the upcoming June 5 guild program, which will be a series of round robin demonstrations via Zoom. Each demo will be from 5 to 10 minutes in length.

Karla Ward reminded the members to please continue donating Birthday Bundles on their birthday month, and to keep bidding on the available bundles. She and **Sharon Savastano** only received one bundle this month, and supplemented that with an additional four bundles with donated fabric and notions from guild members. May 22 will be the deadline to send Karla or Sharon a picture of your birthday bundle before the June meeting.

VP Kristine Richardson broke us all out into small Zoom breakout rooms, where we could visit and discuss upcoming ideas for programs and workshops. Many groups held small show and tell displays from their quilt workstations.

Outgoing President Linda Forry recognized the outgoing board members and thanked them for their service during hurricanes, pandemics and many changes in board procedures. She then installed the new officers for the 2021-22 year, with a wonderful theme of Treasures of the Ocean. She presented **Fran Oblander**—President, **Gaye Paquet**—Vice President, **Jean LeBlanc**—Treasurer, **Julie Hiscox**—Secretary, and **Lill Helming**—Member-at-Large. Linda then reminded the entire guild that these officers will give their time and talents, and asked all members to support them in the upcoming year. Congratulations to the new crew!

Fran Oblander recognized those members who chaired committees this past year, and reminded the guild that she will need help on all committees in the upcoming year. Please consider volunteering as it is a great way to get to know your fellow quilters.

Karla Ward announced that Birthday Bundles were won by Eileen Keohane, Maureen Henault, Fran Oblander, Sylvia Cameron, and Sharon Savastano.

President Linda Forry closed the meeting at 11:05 am.


