A Tribute to the Signal Quilts of the Underground Railroad

Rita Fishel, a native of northeastern Ohio, has a BA in Clothing & Textiles/Business from the University of Akron, and certification in Machine Art through Sew Art International. In late 1992 after relocating from Phoenix, AZ, she purchased Creations SewClever, a full-line quilt shop now housed in an old 1863 Georgian-style funeral home in Chillicothe, OH.

Rita vends, teaches and demos at all the national as well as many regional shows and lots of guild shows. She has published 2 books with AQS (Mystery Quilts and Everyday Quilts) and is currently working on her 3rd. She alsew writes for several quilt publications. Rita teaches on national and international Quilt Cruises and is a designer/consultant and National Demo Goddess for Creative Grids USA rulers.

One of her most requested lectures is based on Signal Quilts of the Underground Railroad. Rita speaks about the folklore/story as told in the book <u>Hidden In Plain View</u>, by Jacqueline L. Tobin and Raymond G. Dobard, Ph.D. and uses the visual aid of a 20-block quilt pieced with blocks inspired by the book. Rita works with the full knowledge and permission of Ms. Tobin and besides re-telling her tale, has researched about 15-20 other sources and incorporated those facts into her talk.

Join us on this fascinating trip back to the time before the Civil War, and use your imagination as we travel through the threads of time.



Maye River Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes December 7, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 by Linda Forry, President.

Jean LeBlanc reported that there were 68 members present, and that 3 new members joined today, bringing our total attendance to 71. We currently have 133 members, and 99 have renewed their membership for 2020.

The minutes from the November meeting were approved as published in the newsletter. The treasurer's report was accepted as published, and filed for audit.

Show and Tell was exceptional, as always. Photos are on our Facebook page so that those not in attendance can see what our talented members have produced recently.

Martha Greenly gave us an update on a prior guild project where we made and gifted 6 quilts for Habitat for Humanity homes in Beaufort. As coordinator of that project, she was invited to the dedication of home #5 on November 30, where a family with 4 children accepted the keys to a 5 bedroom home. The sixth home will be dedicated on December 15.

Linda Forry reminded us all that our May meeting will be on Saturday, May 9, 2020, which is the second Saturday of the month. Palmetto Electric Coop always uses their community room on the first Saturday in May for their annual meeting. Therefore we've moved our meeting back a week in order to use their community room.

Denise Nierstedt has been working on scheduling our quilt retreat, and it will be held at Epworth by the Sea on St. Simon's Island on October 9-11, 2020. There will be all adult ladies present at the Epworth facility that weekend, no children will be onsite.

Joan Darr spoke about the Quilters of South Carolina organization, which is dedicated to promoting quilting. They will be holding their spring meeting in Greenville, SC on March 21. There are workshops scheduled the day before and after the meeting, and more information can be found at their website quiltersofsc.org.

The raffle quilt committee reminded everyone to please turn in money for the raffle tickets you have sold. Money is due at the April meeting. The raffle quilt winner will be drawn on May 2 as stated on the tickets. The winner will be announced at our May 9 meeting.

Nan Brown discussed our progress towards completing 60 quilts for our charitable interest program this year. There is a need for some larger, twin-sized quilts for the older children. Tote bags and cosmetic bags are also needed. A speaker from the DSS program will be attending our meeting in April or May to share some information on the foster children program with us all.

We had a beautiful display of Christmas stockings at our December meeting, made by members to be donated to Veteran's Victory House in Walterboro, SC. Many items to stuff the stockings were also donated. The Hilton Head DAR chapter will be providing additional items for the stockings as a service for our veterans. **Debi Bacon** will deliver the stockings to Walterboro next week.

Minutes of December 7, 2019, continued ~

Elaine Laffey reminded us that at our January 4 meeting our speaker will be Rita Fishel, sharing information on the topic of Underground Railroad Quilts. Our February meeting will be the 5th anniversary celebration of the guild's formation. We will be having a potluck lunch as well as games and a fabric swap.

Kim Gleason reminded us that Rita Fishel will be offering a workshop on Sunday, January 5 at The Haven. A supply list for participants will be emailed, and lunch is NOT provided so you must bring your own. You will buy the "Nova" pattern from Rita, and can buy the Stripology ruler from her at the workshop if you don't yet have one. **Debi Bacon** informed us that the gate code at The Haven will be changing, and that a new code will be sent to participants. Information for all upcoming workshops can be found on our website.

The workshop committee has scheduled afternoon mini-workshops for after our March 7 and April 4 meetings. **Kristine Richardson** will be teaching us her method for making tee shirt quilts. March will be the planning part of the workshop, where she will discuss how she plans her setup. We will then go home and plan our own quilt. At the April workshop, we will actually be making the quilt top using her method. Sue Smith informed us that the Gyleen Fitzgerald workshop "Uptown" will be on Sunday, April 5. This is Palm Sunday, but the committee could not find a location to hold it on Friday so we've finalized the Sunday date.

Linda Forry adjourned the meeting at 10:55, and we proceeded to enjoy refreshments and vote for viewers choice for our stocking project. **Liz Penke** was one winner, the second winner was not present and is TBD.

We all enjoyed Christmas cookies provided by our board members, and a wonderful punch courtesy of our Hospitality committee
