Maye River Quilters had a great year fundraising and selling raffle tickets. Both activities netted the guild more operating funds. However, as a non-profit organization, a certain amount of our funds need to go toward charitable interests. This is not only because we need to address tax implications, but also because we are called on to help those less fortunate. In reviewing our yearly expenditures, and after a positive discussion at the officer's installation meeting, the Board officers voted to donate funds to two local food banks to bring our charitable contributions as a non-profit into balance. We have sent \$300 each to Bluffton Self Help in Beaufort County and to Mercy Mission in Jasper county. In this time of uncertainty, it will be much appreciated by many.

Maye River Quilters Guild June 6, 2020 Guild Meeting via ZOOM

The meeting was called to order on Zoom at 10:00 am by **President Linda Forry**. There were 46 members present and there were no visitors. She reminded us that Palmetto Electric Coop's Community Room is still closed to outside use through June 11 at least, and they are awaiting a decision from Governor McMaster on rules regarding larger gatherings before deciding when they might reopen the room. The guild will be sending out an email questionnaire for members to complete regarding their feelings about attending meetings in person or continuing meetings on Zoom over the summer. The guild has budgeted money to purchase our own Zoom account, which has become necessary for board and guild meetings at this time.

The secretary's report of the May Zoom guild installation meeting, and the treasurer's report that were published in the newsletter will be considered accepted and filed for audit. Any guild member who has a correction to offer can contact the appropriate board member.

New committee chairs for the upcoming year are almost filled, and Linda will be contacting committee chairs from last year so that they can pass forward their information notebooks to the incoming helpers.

The new board has prepared a budget for the 2020-21 guild year, which will be published in the upcoming July newsletter. The guild must vote on this budget; if there is no in-person July meeting we will arrange to have an online vote to ratify the budget for the upcoming year.

Show and Tell online continues at this time. The rules for participation are published on our website. Please continue to send photos of finished quilts to **Holly Martin** for publication.

Our COVID-19 contest is coming up. There will be three categories of quilts counted, full sized quilts, small wall hangings, miniatures, purses etc, and masks. For Part 1 please keep a count of all items finished in each category through June 15. You will receive an email reminding you to send your three numbers to **Linda Forry** to be totalled. We will need at least 50% participation from the guild for this contest to work. Part 2 will begin on July 1 where the members will guess the total number of items produced by the guild. Those guesses are due back July 10; the winner will be announced on July 11 at our next guild meeting.

Our Birthday Bundle monthly fundraiser continues via our website. If your birthday falls in July, please create your birthday bundle. Take a picture and send it to Holly for inclusion on the MRQ website. Directions to bid on bundles are included on the website; just click on the balloons. Birthday Bundle winners for June were Jean LeBlanc, Molly Sauls, and Kim Gleason. After Treasurer Jean LeBlanc receives their check, arrangements will be made for home delivery of their bundles.

Our program for June was an excellent presentation by Kevin Sevier, our local State Farm Insurance Agent. He spoke at length about the need to ensure that our sewing machines, fabric collections, thread and other tools are documented and inventoried so that we can prove ownership for insurance purposes. There are differing categories of coverage due to floods, hurricanes, fires or other catastrophes with varying deductibles written into policies. There's a lot to think about with regards to our insurance coverage level, and each member should begin by checking their homeowners policy to determine what their coverage level presently is. We're each able to decide how much coverage we wish to purchase, and how much risk we're able to accept. For our personal quilts at home, an insurance company will only cover the cost of fabric used to make the quilt, there is no allowance for your time. If you paid a longarmer to quilt it for you, save the receipt or a photo of it as this amount could be included in your insurance claim. Quilt appraisals from a certified appraiser will carry weight with an insurance company as proof of value. Make sure your appraiser has a business license and certification from a recognized association to validate your appraisal.

Linda Forry reminded us to watch our emails, as the guild will probably be sending information out weekly regarding our future meeting plans. The board appreciates how many members were present at our June Zoom meeting, and we look forward to seeing everyone in person sometime soon.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:20 am.

A member received a phishing email this week that had my name and phone number as the sender but the wrong email address. We have reset the password on the MRQ gmail account to protect that, but I wanted you



- 3. Include a description and/or source MAXIMUM of 15 WORDS PLEASE
- 4. Limit 3 submissions per member each month please. You may submit anytime photos will be added regularly.

Creative Grid Stripology Ruler

Doing my time of "quarantine" and recouping from knee surgery, I was looking at Gudrun Erla's website for an interesting pattern for the stripology ruler. Instead, I found her YouTube tutorial for cutting bias binding with the Stripology Ruler. Gudrun demos an easy way to fold on the bias and cut strips on the half inch as well as cutting on the quarter of an inch. On her website under Bonus Charts and templates, there is a chart labeled Quarter Cut Chart that gives you all the numbers to cut multiple strips on the quarter of an inch. If you haven't looked at her website—GE Designs, there is some very interesting information. Just another way to use these rulers we just can't live without!


