PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear MRQ members,

Volume 7, Issue 7

I ended my last message: "as you get requests to help with a committee or the raffle quilt or others please consider being a part of these experiences. You bring a new color (shade, tone or hue) to the mix of fun and learning we have as a guild. Each of you are talented, creative, and resourceful and we need everyone in the mix to have the best mix of color in our "quilt"." A few more people have agreed to join the leadership team but we still need additional volunteers to lead the raffle quilt project and a chair to coordinate publicity. I will begin calling members in July so avoid a call by volunteering now!!

In my last letter I also made note of the color wheel. In one of the books I am reading about color the author (Perry, Gai, 1999. Color from the Heart: Seven Great Ways to Make Quilts with Colors You Love, C&T Publishing.) discusses the color wheel in greater detail and provides an interesting discussion about basic color theory principles including Value, Contrast and Harmonious Color Schemes. These concepts are shared by both artists and quilters alike. Where she suggests we part company is how we look at colors. Instead of focusing on the color wheel guilters are more comfortable with "Color Families". Unless we are dying our own fabric, we depend on the fabric manufacturers for "to supply a palette of desirable colors." (Perry, P. 6). She notes that this palette is made up of Color Families that focus on six spectrum colors – red, orange, yellow, green, blue, and purple. When you think about these six colors across the concepts of values, contrast and harmony you can end up with an infinite variety of tones and hues that create beautiful quilts from neutrals to pastels to bright-brights.



Charitable Interests

A word about Charitable Interests.....

We have a number of great projects in the plans for Charitable Interests for this year.

These are projects that take little time so we should be able to complete an item when we need to take a break from a bigger item.

I met with the activities director at the Pines in Bluffton, formally Bloom in Bluffton. They are excited that we chose them as our Charitable Group.

Just to give you a short overview of the conversation....

They are interested in adult bibs...I will have a pattern for us to use shortly and will make it available at our first in person meeting or before if necessary. There are numerous ideas out there for adult bibs, but to keep it simple for now, the pattern will be pretty easy. The facility has 14 residents in memory care. I am sure they will use more than 14 and the facility washes them between each meal.

They are also interested in pillowcases for 40 + residents. - I am thinking that we should have all enclosed seams if possible or double seamed as these will be washed frequently. If you are not familiar with the Burrito Pillowcase, there are other names for this, please look at You Tube.

Now for fabrics...they are looking for pillowcases and bibs that can be used year round. No red because it bleeds. How well most of us know that. Suggestions were that we avoid geometrics or anything that is too busy, this would include stars. So, more colorful soothing fabrics; thinking fish, sea shells, candy, trucks, cars, animals, license plates like those from row by row, butterflies, etc.

Linda Forry is heading up a subgroup that will be working on fidget quilts for the Vineyard, but also possibly for Hospice and the Pines. So, the fidget quilts are also in the mix for us if you are interested. Linda plans to meet with the Vineyard and find out what restrictions might apply from the DHEC folks. We have been told that there are some limitations. If you are interested in helping with this, please contact Linda at linda4e@gmail.com

A suggestion is to plan an afternoon at the Haven to begin to work on our projects. Is there interest in doing this? Please contact me at mindyzweaver@gmail.com if interested. And we will work to set something up. We are still unsure of when we will be able to use the Palmetto Electric Community Room.

Edie from Granny's donated material for us to use for Charitable interests and Pat Wys is also donating material. So, start stash diving and look for fabrics that you might like to use. I know I am looking through mine. And, thank you Edie and Pat for your generosity.

So, if you are interested in a work afternoon, please let me know and I will work with Debi Bacon to arrange it for us.

Maye River Quilters Guild Minutes

June 5, 2021, Guild Meeting via ZOOM

President Fran Oblander opened the meeting on Zoom at 10:00 am. There were 41 members present, with no new members or visitors attending.

Vice President **Gaye Paquet** called Palmetto Electric Coop to discuss when their meeting room might reopen for our use. There is no decision on reopening at this time but the Coop will decide in June when to reopen. We are hoping to be back to in person meetings in September or October.

The minutes from the May guild meeting were approved as published in the June newsletter. The treasurer's report was accepted as published and will be filed for audit.

Fran noted that there were several items of new business to be discussed and voted on. The votes were conducted by poll and a test poll was done by **Kristine Richardson** prior to the actual voting. Two members had members with them for the Zoom meeting; it was noted that each group of two would have to agree on their one vote.

The first item of new business was the Budget Review. **Debi Bacon** made a motion to adopt the budget as proposed; **Judy Hertel** seconded the motion. The motion was opened for discussion with no questions asked. Attendees voted by poll and the budget was approved unanimously.

Three items were proposed for this year's Charitable Interests projects. **Linda Forry** presented the fidget quilts for patients at The Vineyard, a memory care facility. These are small quilts with manual activities on the front such as zippers, beads, buckles, prairie points, pockets, loops, etc. If this project is selected, the group would have to research safety laws and facility guidance for what could safely be put on the quilts. **Linda** can talk to Libby, who is in charge of the facility about this guidance. The Vineyard has 20 residents currently. There is also a facility on HHI, Memory Matters, that should be reopening soon and would also be interested in this project.

Debi Bacon discussed the pillowcases project which could be donated to The Pines, a facility with 40 residents, mostly women with 7-8 men. The Pines also has memory care patients. They could use adult bibs which are easy to sew. **Debi** suggested we could have a sit and sew to make these items, which would be fun for the members.

Debi also discussed the raffle quilt project proposed for **Osprey Village**. She has not been able to talk to the Osprey management to see if they are interested. The raffle quilt would be created by having members submit blocks to be consolidated into the quilt top. The Osprey management would be given the quilt to raffle off as a fund raiser. **Pat Cohen**, works at the Osprey store and thinks they could use a quilt for raffle as they are still fundraising for the Village.

Fran noted that the attendees would be voting for the one official charitable interest project but the projects not selected could be done by group members unofficially. The guild bylaws state that we select one official project to focus the majority of work and budget on. **Kristine** submitted the poll for group voting; results were 32% for Fidget Quilts, 56% for Pillowcases and Bibs, and 12% for the Osprey Raffle Quilt. The 2021 Charitable Interest project will be the pillowcases and bibs. Chair for Charitable Interests for 2021 is **Mindy Weaver**. **Fran** announced the 2021-22 Committee Chairs: Audit – **Brenda Lucas**, Charitable Interests – **Mindy Weaver**, First Responders – **Eileen Keohane**, Fundraising – **Sharon Savastano & Karla Ward**, Guild Friends – **June Jones**, Historian – **Diane Kretkowski**, Membership – **Sandra Walsh**, Newsletter – **Gaye Paquet**, Programs – April Boyd, Retreat – **Debi Bacon**, Webmaster – **Brenda Lucas**, and Workshops – **Pat Wys**. We still need Publicity and Raffle Quilt Chairs.

April Boyd, Programs Chair, said she is working on a tour of sewing rooms for the July meeting and has several members willing to do tours of their rooms. She is also planning to have the garage sale when we are able to get back to in person meetings.

Pat Wys, Workshops Chair, is planning for some virtual and face to face workshops. Some members have really enjoyed the expanded access Zoom has given us to presenters. She is trying to schedule another workshop with Diana Mann. She is also planning for some lunch and learn workshops.

Sandy Walsh, Membership Chair, said the committee is planning to meet via Zoom soon to talk about how the membership table will work when we are able to once again meet in person.

Debi Bacon, Retreat Chair, noted that she has 13 registrants for the retreat and is looking for more. The registration form was sent out with the June newsletter and is also available on the website. Complete the form with your selections and total the fee due, then submit the form with $\frac{1}{2}$ of the total fee to Debi.

Karla Ward, Fundraising Co-chair, said that birthday bundles is the only current fund raising activity. Once we resume face to face meetings, the committee will start looking at other fundraising activities.

Eileen Keohane is wrapping up the 2020 Charitable Interests and has 7 lap size quilts ready to deliver to the Bluffton PD. Contact Eileen if you have any more lap size quilts to donate.

The program consisted of five demos presented by guild members. Lynn O'Neal did a demo called 'Flange in a Flash', showing how to insert a faux flange in the quilt binding. Gaye Paquet's presentation was 'Seven Deadly Sins of Paper Piecing'; Debi Bacon showed four methods for sewing Flying Geese; Lill Helming demonstrated several methods for making Half Square Triangles and Pat Wys showed a quick method for cutting bias strips for bias binding plus discussing why bias binding should be used on all your quilts. Several of these presentations were pre-recorded videos and will be made available on our YouTube channel. Links will be sent out to all members via email and will be available on the website.

Birthday bundles were won by **Sandra Walsh, Julie Hiscox** (twice), **Sharon Savastano**, **Fran Oblander** and **Judy Hertel**.

Sue Smith noted that Island Quilters is having a warehouse sale this weekend and Sylvia Cameron announced that Sew Suite Studio is having their Grand Opening on July 14th (although they are already open).

Fran Oblander adjourned the meeting at 11:30 a.m.
