In the 19th century, quilt show and tells were held in a different way. A girl would make 13 quilts in anticipation of being married. A precursor to a wedding shower was friends and family bringing gifts and well wishes before the wedding and she would show her quilts. They were piled on top of a bed and as she "turned" them down would tell stories about the quilt, her life as she made them, what fabrics she used and where they came from. Women also did not have much chance to socialize and when they did it was usually at someone's home. They would bring quilts to share but since space was limited, would stack them on top of each other and each, in turn, would talk about her quilt.

In May, we are going to feature quilts from two guild members in our version of a bed turning. No, the Program Committee won't be bringing in a bed. But we'll create a "bed-like" atmosphere and show you some interesting quilts. Please join us as we feature two prolific and talented quilters.

### Maye River Quilters Guild Minutes

April 2, 2022—Church of the Palms

President Fran Oblander opened the meeting at 10:03 am.

There were 44 members and 1 visitor present.

**Fran** started with the introduction of our guest at the meeting. **Joyce Hoskins** introduced Linda Farineau, who moved here last July from Massachusetts. Linda has been quilting for 35 years, belonged to two quilt guilds in MA, her favorite quilt block is the churn dash and she is the guest of Lill Helming and Cathy Harris.

The March meeting minutes were published in the newsletter. **Fran** asked if there were any corrections from the members; no corrections were raised. **Debi Bacon** made a motion to approve the minutes, **Judy Hoskins** seconded the motion, and minutes were approved with no objections.

The treasurer's report was also printed in the newsletter. Fran asked if there were any questions on the treasurer's report. There were no questions so the report will be filed for audit. The next item on the agenda was show and tell. Seventeen quilts were shown including one version of this year's mystery quilt.

**Fran** announced that the big item on the agenda for this meeting is election of the next guild board. As there are two candidates for Vice President, there will be paper ballots distributed for voting on that position; the remaining candidates will be approved by acclamation of the members present.

**Lill Helming**, chair of the nominating committee, was called upon to introduce the candidates for next year's board. Lill noted that passing around paper ballots is required by the guild bylaws when there is more than one candidate for a position. A basket will be passed around for members to place their ballots in. Each candidate was introduced by Lill and asked to give a short bio to the members.

**Cynthia Cassidy**, candidate for President, has been quilting for about four years and a member of the guild for three years. Her children are raised and she is ready to take on a new job as president of the guild.

**Gaye Paquet**, candidate for Vice President and current Vice President, is originally from Alaska. She has been in this area for about 14 years and joined the guild in its second year. She's been quilting since the late 70's. She tries other things periodically, then comes back to quilting. In addition to being current Vice President, Gaye is also editor of the newsletter.

**Karen Park-Bigelow**, our second candidate for Vice President, is new to our guild. She has lived here for three years and previously lived in Greenville, working for a quilt shop. She learned to quilt as a child by pushing the needle up from under the quilt frame while her mother, grandmother and aunt were quilting. She did some quilting then, a lot more now and does long arm quilting as well.

**Suzanne McClure**, candidate for Secretary, is also new to the guild, and has been quilting since she was about eight years old.

**Carol Treanor**, candidate for Treasurer, has 15 years' experience as a club treasurer in Sun City. She has been quilting since 2009 and she can't fit one more yard of fabric in her house.

**Diane Kretkowski**, candidate for Member at Large, has been a member almost since the first meeting. She has been on the guild board before, has been quilting for over 50 years and believes in giving back to the Guild.

**Lill** noted that there is a sixth position on the board which is the past president. That position will automatically be filled by **Fran Oblander**.

**Lill**, as nominating chair, made a motion for the slate to be accepted as presented with the Vice President position to be determined by paper ballot. Fran stated that the members would be voting by acclamation for the President, Secretary, Treasurer and Member at Large, and that selection of Vice President would be announced after the program when the ballots had been counted. All voted aye for the four uncontested positions, with no one opposed.

**Pat Wys**, introduced Nancy Mahoney, who has over 300 magazine appearances, written 15 books, designed fabric, edited books, taught internationally, and is a Bernina ambassador. She also edited Pat Wys's first quilting book. "Spotlight on Neutrals". That book went on to be a best-seller, thanks to Nancy's excellent editing.

Nancy Mahoney gave an excellent presentation on her quilting history, techniques and design theory and showed beautiful examples of her quilts.

**Fran** reminded all present that if they put something on the free table and it is still there at the end of the meeting, please take it home with you or Fran will have to put it in the trash.

**Fran** announced that all the raffle tickets are out. Please be sure to bring your stubs and money to the May meeting. There will also be a reminder in the newsletter. Raffle drawing will be in June.

There were a lot of membership renewals today. Members can also renew through the website. There will be email and newsletter reminders soon.

At the May meeting, the program will be a bed turning. New board officers will be installed, and there will be recognition of members who have given exceptional service this year.

The June meeting will be our ice cream party. We will play three games, one of which will be Left, Right, Center. This time, the members are asked to bring six themed fat quarters—either Christmas, patriotic, batik or solid fat quarters. There will be more information in the newsletter.

Fran asked for any other announcements. There were none.

**Fran** announced the new officers: President—**Cynthia Cassidy**; Vice President—**Gaye Paquet**; Secretary—**Suzanne McClure**; Treasurer—**Carol Treanor**; Member-at-large—**Diane Kretkowski**; and Past President—**Fran Oblander**. A photo was taken of all present.


