

### MRQ 2023 BLOCK CHALLENGE



### **QUILT CHALLENGE GUIDELINES:**

- Present a finished quilt (quilted and bound) at the May meeting
- Quilt may include one or more of the 11 blocks demonstrated, you can choose the traditional, wonky/modern or both.
- You may include all three challenges in your creation.
  - ♦ Traditional or Wonky block—you may use any or all of the 10 blocks presented.
  - ♦ Border Mania—you may use any of the fancy border ideas presented in September or create a fancy border of your own.
  - ♦ Ugly Fat Quarter—you may use the ugly fat quarter given out by Diane Kretkowski.
- Minimum quilt size is 24" x 36", but may be as large as you wish.
- You may embellish or not, your choice.
- Quilt must be completed and bound for submission in May.
- Labels must be on the back of the quilted items to be judged in May. The label should include your name and the name of the challenge(s) you wish to be judged on. Label can be paper and pinned on. Please write clearly.
- Use your imagination!
- Challenge your creativity!
- Prizes will be awarded for:
  - ♦ Best use of Ugly Fat Quarter
  - Best use of Monthly Featured Blocks
  - ♦ Best use of a Fancy Border
  - ♦ Most Creative Border
  - ♦ Triple Challenge Award Best use of FQ, Monthly featured blocks, and border in same quilt
  - ♦ Other Awards as determined by Program and Workshop chairs

Remember: Most important - HAVE FUN!!



## JULIE'S JOTTINGS Julie Hiscox



**Do you struggle with accurate seam allowances?** I do. I have often used a ruler to measure the accurate width, applied tape to my sewing machine to mark the width, then struggled to remove the tacky glue from my machine when I'm done.

I have a foot for my sewing machine that is ¼" wide but that means I have to focus on the foot all the time when I'd rather have a long marking to line up the fabric with as it travels toward the needle, increasing my accuracy.

About a month ago, I was searching for tape made for marking seam width when I ran across something even better. It is called a Grid Glider; one is made by Sew Steady and another by Elevate Your Creativity. I bought both to try out on each of my sewing machines.

If you have ever used the Supreme Slider made by Free Motion Slider, this is a very similar product. The top surface is slick so your fabric slides easily across it and the back is lightly sticky. It can be applied, removed leaving no residue, and reapplied again. The only downside is that it requires your machine to sit in a cabinet with a level surface around the needle.

There are markings for various seam widths, markings at every half inch to assist with decorative stitching at any width, and diagonal lines for lining up fabric for diagonal seams, like those half square triangles we love so much.

I find I prefer the Sew Steady version because the green background and white lines are more visible for me. The other version uses a pink background with predominantly white lines and my eyes are age challenged.
