Program—March 7

Our Program Committee has planned a program for all to enjoy this month. At our March meeting. we will present our always popular Round Robin Demos. This year the ideas are new and the theme will be "PRECUTS GO MODERN".

Some interesting and unique ways to quilt using Jelly Rolls, Layer Cakes and Charm Packs will be demonstrated at 4 different stations. You will see clever ways to make quilts and rugs and tablerunners. Each design will be shown in a step by step process to show you just how easy it can be to create these new designs. Come and see how many different designs can be adapted when working with precut fabric packs.

7-Shirt Workshop—Part 1

Our own Kristine Richardson will conduct a workshop on making a T-Shirt quilt. In March she will teach her construction technique and show us how to adjust the sizes of the T-Shirts to make the most of the designs. She will allow practice time on scrap material which she will provide. Then participants will be sent home with ideas to design their own layout and choose their size. In the second session in April, each participant will come back with her T-Shirts and other fabrics, and Kristine will assist each person to construct her original layout. Her technique requires a walking foot, but no interfacing is necessary. Instructions are available on the MRQ website.



Registration fee will be \$30.00, which will cover both 4 hour sessions. Registration form is on the website.

Workshop will be held after the general meetings on **March 7, 2020**, and **April 4, 2020**, both dates from 12:30 - 4:30 pm. Location is at Palmetto Electric.

Maye River Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes February 1, 2020

President **Linda Forry** called the meeting to order at 10:00. She then presented a comprehensive reminder of the guild's five year history and growth. **Debi Bacon**, a founding mother of the guild, reminded us that there were 29 charter members. She asked those charter members present to stand; we still had half of them present at this meeting!

Janet Swan introduced our six visitors; we also had one returning member. **Sandy Walsh** announced that we had 71 members present, 6 visitors, and 2 new members today for a total of 79 present for our anniversary meeting.

A wonderful show and tell display was presented.

The minutes from the January meeting were accepted as published in the newsletter. The treasurers' report was accepted as published, and will be filed for audit.

Linda Forry announced that we have received the bill from our tax accountant for the IRS 501c3 form we must file. We had budgeted \$500 but the bill is \$750. Last year the form was kicked back three times via computer by the IRS. This year our accountant took extra time to make sure it was filled out as the IRS wanted. Our by-laws state that any expenditure more than \$150 over budget must be approved by the membership. **Cindy Rosenberry** made a motion to pay the \$750 bill, seconded by **Diane Kretkowski**. It was unanimously approved by the membership. In subsequent years, we will budget a higher amount for tax preparation, as this is a complex form that requires the expertise of a tax professional.

Sue Smith informed us that she learned through Island Quilters quilt shop that there is a volunteer group teaching sewing skills at the SC Allendale prison. The teachers are looking for good sized quilt scrap strips in order to make tote bags which the prisoners are able to sell. We would just be donating scraps, not participating in the teaching process.

Joan Darr spoke about Quilters of SC, a state-wide group of quilters. Their upcoming spring meeting will be held in Greenville, SC in late March. Classes are full but new members are welcome and can sign up to attend the meeting.

Linda Forry received word from **Sharon Savastano** that the Boys and Girls Club quilting class is currently making rail fence quilts. They are progressing well, and are a fun group of nine year olds to work with. More volunteers are needed to help in this project, and anyone interested can contact Sharon Savastano, Eileen Keohane, Janet Swan, Pat Cohen, or Joan Darr for more information on this fun project.

The raffle quilt committee has asked us all to drop off ticket proceeds at their table, and to please pick more packs of tickets to sell. They have 29 more packs to be sold, and all ticket proceeds must be returned at the April meeting. The drawing for the quilt will be done on May 2.

The charitable interest committee is still in need of cosmetic cases to accompany the donation quilts for foster children. At our March 7 meeting, Ms. Bradley will speak to us regarding our quilt donations and the difference they have made to the recipients.

The program committee spoke about the round robin demonstrations that will be a part of our March meeting. The demos will be a surprise, but we got a teaser that the jelly roll rug will be one of the projects demonstrated. You will have to attend on March 7th to find out what else they have planned! April 4th's program will be a talk by Gyleen Fitzgerald on the "Path to Modern".

The workshop committee reminded us that all information about upcoming workshops is available on our website. **Kristine Richardson** is offering a two-part workshop on planning and constructing a tee shirt quilt. This will be held in March and April following our meetings at the Palmetto Electric Coop, with the first session involving planning the quilt, and the second session teaching construction of the quilt top. On April 5, Gyleen Fitzgerald will be offering a workshop to make her pattern, "Uptown".

Denise Nierstedt announced that the nominating committee is putting together a slate of officers for the upcoming elections. Anyone interested in being an officer for our guild is asked to speak with **Denise**, **Gaye Paquet**, or any current officer for more information.

Linda Forry reminded all members that any items you bring for the free table must be taken home with you if they remain after the meeting.

Linda thanked **Lucy Wick, Joyce Haskins**, and the entire hospitality committee for their work to ensure that we have a bountiful pot-luck luncheon for our fifth anniversary celebration. The business meeting was adjourned at 10:55 so that we could enjoy good food, prizes, games and social time.




