


### Sunday, November 5, 2023 Pat Wys—The Art of the Needle with Machine Applique **Techniques**


#### To all MRQ members:

#### **VETERANS' HOME POUCH INSTRUCTIONS**

- Cut two (2) pieces of fabric to 8" x 10-1/2". Finished size is 7" x 9".
- You can pink, zigzag your seams or do a narrow French seam. Up to you.
- Turn in the upper opening to either make a casing for the elastic or stretch and sew the elastic on the inside of the pouch. Again, up to you.
- Lastly, make sure the ribbon is securely fastened on the seam line. (Ribbon is **not** to be used as drawstring).

Elastic is 10" long and the ribbon is 36" long.


