- Make at least one stocking using the pattern. Other than using the size of the pattern, you can design your own. Embellish, trim, applique, piece the front. It is totally up to you as to what your stocking will look like. Yes, patriotic stockings are welcome as are Christmas fabrics.
- Each stocking must have a hanging loop, a lining and must be the size of the pattern.
- Bring your stocking to the December meeting. Those attending will have a chance to vote for "Best of Show" and "Most Original". OF COURSE, there are prizes for those two stockings.
- We will collect the stockings and they will be displayed at the Emily Geiger Christmas luncheon. Afterwards, chapter members will stuff them with personal care items and deliver them in time for Christmas to Veterans Victory House.

## Maye River Quilters Guild Minutes

September 11, 2021, via Zoom

**President Fran Oblander** opened the meeting on Zoom at 10:00 am. There were 36 members present. **Fran** recognized the 20th anniversary of 9/11/2001 in remembrance of the events of that day.

Minutes of the August meeting were published in the last newsletter. **Fran** requested any changes and none were proposed. Motion to approve was made and seconded. Motion to approve was unanimously passed by the membership. Minutes will be filed for the record.

The Treasurer's Report was also published in the last newsletter. **Fran** requested corrections; none were proposed. The Treasurer's Report will be filed for audit.

#### Announcements

We are planning the December meeting to be in-person but October and November will be virtual.

**Gaye and Linda** are looking into other spaces that might allow in-person meetings. There are problems associated with cost of some spaces. We are continuing to monitor COVID numbers to plan for the future.

All Carolina Shop Hop is coming up in October. There are four quilt shops in Bluffton/Hilton Head that are participating. The Shop Hop magazine is available in the quilting stores and includes patterns.

**Fran** reminded members that the Mystery Quilt-a-long starts this month. The first clue will be distributed after the meeting today.

#### Program—Diana Mann

**Pat Wys** introduced Diana Mann with her history in quilting and Studio 180. **Pat** gave a history of Studio 180 and the tools available. She then presented how the tools are used and gave examples of what can be created with each tool.

#### Committee Reports

Charitable Interests—Mindy Weaver said the guild has made about 75 bibs and 70-75 pillowcases. Linda and Mindy took some bibs and pillowcases to Caris Hospice. Caris was very happy to receive them and sent Linda a thank-you note with she read to the members. Mindy and Linda also took 40 bibs and 50 pillowcases to the Pines in Bluffton. Camille mentioned that they may have use for more bibs and pillowcases from us. Currently Mindy has 23 bibs and 19 pillowcases available. Mindy knows there are people current working on these items and asked that they notify her when they are complete so she can pick them up.

Caris is also interested in fidget quilts. **Linda** will host a workshop at the Haven for the fidget quilts on October 30; new information is available on the guild website for how these will be done. **Linda** will bring the base and members will make pieces to put on the base. **Mindy** showed a pocked with beads in it that she made as an example.

Caris Hospice also asked for "at ease" quilts. **Mindy** has three volunteers in the guild interested in making these quilts. They will be the size of a large, 54" x 72", throw quilt. **Susan Tyler** made embroidered pieces that say "At Ease" to be sewn onto these quilts.

**Retreat**—All registrants are fully paid but there are still some slots available. **Debi** has one person who would like a roommate for the retreat. If you register now, you need to pay the full amount for the retreat.

**Programs—April Boyd** secured seven people to talk about seven different blocks for the October meeting. They will be giving the history and method of construction for each block. The committee is planning for an in-person December Christmas party at the Haven. They are considering having prepared food items, a simple gift exchange and a basket raffle. **Fran** is asking board members to consider making a basket. Others may also donate a basket if they wish. **Debi** suggested that each basket have a theme.

Workshops—Diana Mann is doing a workshop tomorrow. Eighteen people are currently signed up and there is room for two more. In October, Becky Robinson of Sew Sweet Studio will do a workshop on October 9 covering the A-Zs of domestic machine quilting, from preparation to finishing. The workshop will be held in her classroom space at the store. If there are more than ten people, the class will be moved to the Haven. Becky will prepare \$15 supply kits for each attendee and lunch will be provided. Registration is still open for this workshop. In November, Diane Knott from Cummings, GA, will do a virtual program on "Scrap Secrets". December is the Christmas party. In January, guild member Cynthia Cassidy will present a collage quilting workshop.

Mystery Quilt—Joan Darr postponed start date in hope of meeting in-person but that won't happen. The first clue will be sent out today after the meeting and after each subsequent meeting. The Studio 180 Corner Beam ruler won't be needed until the fourth month. Diana Mann plans to give us instructions on using this ruler. The first clue will be about cutting and Joan suggests having a system to organize the pieces, i.e. baggies. 34 people have signed up for this mystery quilt project. Sylvia suggested the participants have one or two Zoom meetings for the participations to share progress. These will be set up.

**Small Interest Groups—Judy Hertel** has six people who are interested in setting up small interest groups. We are going to wait to start these until COVID numbers decline so we can meet in person.

**Mentor Program—Karla Ward** said several people have signed up but again we will wait to start these in person.

**Membership—Jan Sinclair and Barbara Marsee** are new members who joined in August. **Kathy Harris and Karen Park-Bigelow** joined in the last week. Karen and Jan introduced themselves to the group.
