Maye River Quilters Guild Minutes

June 4, 2022—Church of the Palms

The meeting was called to order by **President Cynthia Cassidy** at 10:00 at the Church of the Palms.

Cynthia asked the Guild Friends to introduce the guest members in attendance. They were Barbara Heagney, Mary Carter, Vicki Nash (joined), Laura Casey (joined) and Diane Merrick (joined).

Cynthia discussed her expectations for the guild for both the board and the membership.

Cynthia requested questions or changes to the minutes of the last meeting as printed in the newsletter. **Lill Helming** moved to clarify that the changes to the bylaws would be voted on in July rather than today. **Debi Bacon** seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Cynthia asked for any questions about the financial statement. There were none. The report will be filed for audit.

Cynthia introduced the new chairs that were present and asked for volunteers to chair the Hospitality, Guild Friends and Publicity committees.

The committee reports followed.

- Karen Park-Bigelow, Program Chair/Lill Helming, Workshop Chair asked members to fill out the questionnaire at the check in desk. They gave a review of the year's program and workshops, explaining how challenges will be presented. The first is the Block of the Month. Cynthia showed a traditional four patch and a modern four patch. Each month a guild member will demonstrate a new block. The challenge is to have some or all of these blocks in a finished quilt project by May 2023. Prizes will be awarded. Members are to sign up with Fran Oblander to demonstrate a block. Details about the finished product will be published in the newsletter. The Charleston Quilt Guild will have a trunk show of modern quilts at the July 2023 meeting. This will be followed by a faces workshop taught by Cynthia Cassidy.
- **Debi Bacon**, Fundraising Chair/Retreat Chair explained the Birthday Bundles and the scrap bag fundraisers that would happen monthly. A prize will be given at the end of the year for the person whose birthday bundles bring in the most money this year. Debi reminded members that your contributions are tax deductible and receipts are available upon request. The Fall Retreat will be September 9 11 and sign ups begin today. 9 of the 12 spots available.
- **Gaye Paquet**, Newsletter Chair and **Brenda Lucas**, Web Site Chair have dead-lines the 17th of each month.
- **Joan Darr**, Membership Chair reported five guests and 36 members present. Joan will have a list of the contents of the new member folder published in the newsletter; any member wishing one can ask for it next month. Name tags are available for pick up from her.

Cynthia announced bylaw amendments will be voted on at the July meeting. **Debi Bacon** suggested it would be helpful to go to the Maye River website and look at the existing wording with the changes proposed side by side. **Gaye Paquet** will email the proposed amendments again to everyone.

Cynthia announced the 2022-2023 Charitable Interest will be placemats for Meals on Wheels. Details will be published in an upcoming newsletter.

Cynthia announced the proposed budget was distributed and asked for questions. **Debi Bacon** moved to approve the budget as presented. **Fran Oblander** seconded the motion. The motion was approved.

Fran Oblander gave the raffle quilt summary from last year. Debi Bacon won a prize for selling the most tickets. Linda Pirtle drew the winning ticket, Linda Farineau. As Lill Helming sold the winning ticket she was also awarded a prize. Fran showed the quilt made by Lill to be raffled this year. The quilt and the tickets to be sold will be ready by September.

Debi Bacon inducted the new Board with a description of their duties and a presentation of star blocks. They were challenged to use the blocks to create a quilted item and present it at the May 2023 meeting.

Cynthia asked for a volunteer to coordinate a trip to Quilt Con in Atlanta GA February 23-25, 2023.

Show and Tell was presented.

The program this month was a presentation of quilted creations by the new board members. Each member shared several items they had made with a brief description of each. The program also included an ice cream social and one game of Left-Right-Center.

Birthday bundle winners were announced.

Cynthia adjourned the meeting at 11:50 am.

PROPOSED BYLAW AMENDMENTS

President Fran Oblander appointed a Bylaws Committee to review our current bylaws and make recommendations for amendments. This newsletter includes a document with those recommended changes. When members don't work with bylaws much, often we don't under how this process works so here is a guide:

- 1. Find the current bylaws dated October 3, 2020 on our website at https://static1.squarespace.com/static/5bb6a86a7a1fbdo13ocf4869/t/5f9oac9ce6fa3e43c36949e2/1603316894235/MRQ+By-Laws%2C++Revised+Oct.+3%2C+2020.pdf
- 2. Use the recommended amendments document to see the changes.
 - A. The left hand column refers to a section of the bylaws (for example: Article III B). This column contains the current wording with those words that will be changed in red.
 - B. The center column shows the current wording "redlined". This means that words that will be stricken have a red line through them and words that will be added are in red.
 - C. The right hand column shows how that section of the bylaws will look **if the amendment is passed.**
- 3. Review those recommended changes and make any notes if you have questions. The Chair will be prepared to answer your questions.
- 4. This publication serves as your notice that the bylaw amendments will be on the agenda at the July meeting. Be prepared to vote for the amendments.
- 5. At the July meeting, assuming a quorum is present (20% of our membership) the Bylaws Committee will move that the amendments be accepted and the members present will vote. Passage of the amendment(s) require a simple majority of those present. This can happen for all the amendments together, or each amendment could be a separate vote.


